*** John Dalton is a laborer for the B&M RR. He rooms in Wells River. In 1919 John is listed as being a blacksmith helper at the B&M round house off the south end of Central Street, by Beech Street entrance. John lives in Wells River. In 1925 John Dalton is a clerk at 47 Central Street, Spoffords Drug Store. John is still boarding in Wells River. (1925) John F. Dalton died May 15th, 1950.

*** Thomas Dalton is a brakeman on the railroad. He is rooming at 18 Highland Street, the home of Harland Peaslee. (1925)



Dana ... Mr. and Mrs. E. L. Dana removed to Wells River, Vermont. (1943)

Dandy Diner ... The Dandy Diner, at 42 Central Street, across the street from Hotel Wentworth, is operated by M. B. Homans and J. C. Rutledge, who also operate the South End Diner, at the end of Central Street, on the Beech street corner. (1935-37)

Dane ... Dorothy L. Dane is a registered nurse at Cottage Hospital, on River Road. Dorothy boards in North Haverhill, NH. (1953-55)

Danforth ... Charles Danforth is a laborer and is presently rooming at E. J. Chamberlain's on Mill Street. (1915)

*** Alice M. Daniels, widow of Nathan A. Daniels, has a home at 2 North Court Street. (1953-58)

*** Doreen R. Daniels, Miss, is employed at Cottage Hospital and boarding with her parents at 2 North Court Street, Ralph Daniels. (1956-58)

*** Eunice G. Daniels, Miss, is boarding at 21 Gordon Place, the home of Nathan A. Daniels. (1929-31) Eunice Daniels is presently boarding at 13b King

Darling's, rfd #2. (1929-31) Agnes is now teaching in Haverhill, Mass., and boarding at W. V. Darling's. (1935-37) Agnes is now teaching in Melrose, Mass., and boarding at W. V. Darling's. (1953-55)

*** Christina A. Darling, Miss, is a student at Plymouth Normal School, and boarding at W. V. Darling's, rfd #2. (1929-31) She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. W. E. Darling and married Allen Gilbert of St. Johnsbury on 8-8-33. Christina graduated from Woodsville High School in 1927.

*** Clyde H. Darling is a farmer (Darling and Son), rfd #2. Clyde and Beatrice Darling live on the farm. (1929-55)

*** Elsie E. Darling, Miss, is a student at Woodsville High School. Elsie is boarding with W. V. Darling's, RFD #2. (1925) Elsie is teaching in Rochester, NH. and boarding at W. V. Darling's, RFD #2. (1929-31)

*** Erla Darling, Miss, graduated from Woodsville High School in 1940 and entered Plymouth Teachers college.

*** Eva A. Darling, Miss, is a student at Plymouth Normal School. Eva is boarding with W. V. Darling's, RFD #2. (1925)

*** George S. Darling graduated from Woodsville High School and went on to get a degree in English at UNH in 1941.

*** Hollis O. Darling is a linotype operator at 17a Central Street, the Woodsville Publishing Company. Hollis has a home on Terrace Street in Wells River, Vermont. (1935-37)

*** Leslie S. Darling is a farmer (Darling & Sons) on the Woodsville-Bath Road, RFD #2, where Leslie and Sarah Darling are making their home. (1925-31) Leslie and Sarah removed to Monroe, NH, prior to 1935.

*** Nora B. Darling, Miss, is a teacher in North Thetford, Vermont, boarding with W. V. Darling's, RFD #2. (1929-31) Nora is teaching in Wells River, Vermont and still boarding with W. V. Darling's, RFD #2. (1935-37) Nora is teaching in Wells River and boarding with Mrs, E. S. Darling. (1953-55)

*** Ralph C. Darling is a farmer (Darling & Sons) on the Woodsville-Bath Road, RFD #2, where Ralph Darling is making his home. (1925) Ralph and Ruth M. Darling are boarding at W. V. Darling's, rfd #2. (1929-31)

*** Samuel G. Darling is a student at Woodsville High School, boarding at William V. Darling's on Swiftwater Road. (1935-37) Samuel graduated from Woodsville High School in 1937 and entered the University of New Hampshire.

*** Theodore E. Darling, a graduate of Woodsville High school 1930, is attending UNH while boarding at W. V. Darling's, rfd #2. (1929-37)

*** William V. Darling is a farmer (Darling & Sons) on the Woodsville-Bath Road, RFD #2, where William and Evalona S. Darling are making their home. (1925-37) William passed away on December 12th, 1942 and Evalona is living on Bath Road. (1953-55)

*** Wilson C. Darling is a farmer. Wilson and Madelyn live on the farm on Bath Road. (1953-55)

*** Darling and Son (William V. and Clyde H. Darling) farmers, rfd #2 outside of Woodsville. (1925-55)

Datz ... William Datz is a junk dealer. William and Annie Datz have a home at 17 Ammonoosuc Street. (1929-31)

David s Men s Shop ... David's Men's Shop is operated by David B. Riggie, selling men's clothing and apparel, at 41 Central Street, the Henderson Block. David, the son-in-law of Mr. Henderson, opened his men's shop in May of 1937. David had been a clerk in Sargents Store, prior to opening his own store and died in 1961. The Riggie's had two sons, David and Douglas, both living in Woodsville. 2008-11

Davis & Clough Livery ... horse & auto livery at 3 Pleasant Street (1914). They also sold carriages and harnesses. D&C had bought out Newton Lang, previously from Bath, NH. Lang was a wheelwright in Woodsville before relocating in Lisbon, NH.

Davis & Rinehart Livery ... auto livery located at 129 Central Street (1919). The livery business is at 3 and 9 Pleasant Street in 1925. Davis and Rinehart are open day and night, offering wagons and sleighs, single and double hitches, with or without driver.

Autos furnished with experienced chauffeurs. The telephone at the stable is 158-2 and the office number is 158-4. (1919-37)

Davis ...

*** Arthur E. Davis, born in Vermont in 1861, and Blanche S. Davis, born in 1870, are living here in 1930. Arthur owned the Parker House livery in 1887. Mr. Richardson, owner of the hotel, erected a large addition to the livery and Mr. Davis took advantage of the extra space, utilizing it to sell carriages, buggies,

wagons and surreys. He sold the carriage business in 1897 to Nute Lang, from across the covered bridge, in Bath.

The stable burned in the Odd Fellows fire of 1901. Mr. Davis rebuilt after the fire. Davis took on Mr. Clough in the livery business as "Davis & Clough" livery. Mr. Davis was deputy sheriff with a house on Court Street (1915). Davis was Chief of Police. (1895-96 and 1904-34) Listed as having a house on Pleasant in 1919. I was told, in a recent interview with a town elder, that Mr. Davis came to Woodsville from out West.

He was a very tall man and made people feel very safe by patrolling the streets every night. He wore a cowboy hat, western boots and vest, and a checkered shirt. Arthur and Blanche are living at 75 Central Street.(1925-31) Arthur is living at 21 Pleasant Street.(1935-37) Blanche Davis passed away prior to 1937.

*** A. T. Davis was the fireman on a train wreck in Pike NH, 3-20-1908. Also killed was Guy Dow, the engineer. Albert Cromwell was the conductor on the train.

*** Benjamin V. Davis is a treasurer at 11 Pine Street, Cummings Construction Company. He has a home in Ware, Mass. (1935-37)

*** Carl A. Davis, born in New Hampshire in 1891, is a plumber at R.R Scruggs. Carl and Marion, born in 1889, have a house on South Court Street (1915). Living with them in 1930 is their son, C Howard Davis, born in 1919.

*** Charles E. Davis is a paper hanger. Charles and Maud live at 22 Connecticut Street (1919). Charles is listed as a paper maker at Adams Paper Company, Wells River, Vermont. (1925) The Davis's are residing at 24 Connecticut Street. (1929-31) The Davis' removed to Wells River, Vermont, prior to 1935. The Davis' are still residing at 22 Connecticut Street. (1925)

*** Charles E. Davis, born in Alabama in 1891, and Annie M. Davis, born in 1893, are living here [Connecticut street?] in 1930 with ... their son Lawrence E. Davis age 17, their daughter Dorothy R. Langford age 5, and Charles mother Sarah N. Davis age 60.

*** Dixie D. Davis is an agent for the American Express Company. Dixie and Emma have a house at 5 1/2 Elm Street. (1919)

*** Ella Davis, Miss, is a waitress at Hotel Wentworth. She rooms at A.M. Connors on School Street. (1915-1919)

*** Eva Davis, Miss, is a waitress at Hotel Wentworth and rooms at A.M. Connors on School Street. (1915-1919)

*** J. A. Davis purchased a bottling works business on Connecticut Street, from Fred Stevens, in 1892.

*** Hiram Davis, born in Alabama or Georgia about 1865, is the chef at Hotel Wentworth on Central Street and rooms at the hotel (1915). Listed as having a house at 26 Connecticut Street in 1919. Hie wife Sarah Davis was born in Georgia in 1870. In 1925 Hiram is employed in Wells River and still living at 26 Connecticut Street. (1925-37) The Davis's are living here in 1920 with ... their daughter Ritta Langford age 31, and her children ... Helen Langford age 13, Lester Langford age 11, Earnest Langford age 4, Majorie Langford age 2, twins Ronald and Donald Langford age 1.

*** John L. Davis worked at the Mount Gardner House and stable in 1872. He

purchased a boarding house from Mrs. Hortense Ramsay in 1872. It became the Parker House, the first hotel in Woodsville. Davis previously had a 30 year career with the railroad and fought in the Civil War. In 1876 he had the Mount Gardner House built. This was located where McAllister Jewelers and the bowling alley are presently located. This was the second hotel in Woodsville. The name "Parker House" started when E. G. Parker began operating the hotel in 1873.

*** Lawrence Davis is boarding at 26 Connecticut Street, the home of Hiram Davis. (1935-37)

*** Merton E. Davis, Mrs., is the cook at the Grafton County Farm. She boards at the same. (1919-31)

*** Norman Davis is a truck driver for First National Stores in North Haverhill, NH. Norman and Patricia D. Davis have a home at 4 High Street. Patricia first worked for Lisbon Shoe Company and is now employed by Cottage Hospital. (1953-58)

*** Pauline E. Davis, Miss, is boarding at H. H. Waddell's on Brier Hill, RFD #2. (1925)

*** Reginald E. Davis, a salesman, removed to Boston, Mass., prior to 1931.

*** Walter E. Davis, born in Vermont in 1874, is a lumber inspector. Walter and Saloma E. Davis, born in 1884, have a home at 87 Central Street. (1929-31) The Davis's are living here with ... their daughter Elsie D. Roberts age 21, her husband Gerald L Roberts age 24, and their son Maurice L. Roberts age 1.

*** Winfield A. Davis is a plumber for Rhett Scruggs. He and Mary Davis are boarding at 17 Court Street (1919).

Davison and Bailey ... Davison and Bailey were early tenants in the Brick Block near the crossings at Highland Street and Perkins Place. They started business here in 1886.

Davison ...

*** Anna M. Davison, Miss, is a stenographer in the register of deeds office. Anna is boarding at 129 Central Street, the home of Charles N. Davison (Woodsville Bakery). (1925)

*** Charles N. Davison came to Woodsville in 1880 and entered employment with the railroad as a fireman and then as an engineer. Davison was born in Canada on August 25th, 1861. He gave up his job with the railroad because of ill health and engaged in the grocery and bakery business in the Odd Fellows Block. In 1907 Davison moved his bakery business to his new building on Central Street. Charles N. and Lizzie M. Davison, born in 1866, live off Central Street. C. N.

Davison bought the old graded school at auction in 1899, for \$100.00. The school, on School St. had been replaced and Davison moved the old building to his lot at 129A Central Street. (The opposite corner from Dr. Campbell's house and office.)

The upstairs of the Davison Hall was used as a hall for suppers, dances, lectures, etc. The first moving pictures in Woodsville were shown here by a man from St. Johnsbury, Vt. Several, different business occupied the downstairs including, Rhett Scruggs plumbing and furnaces, Cyrus Cameron moved his furniture business here from the Brick Block on Highland Street.

Woodsville Bakery, and Davison's Cafe were also here. Mr. Davison's daughter is Anna Davison Proctor (Mrs. Carl Proctor), and Harold K. Davison is his nephew. (1925) Charles is operating a public auto, at 129 Central Street, in 1931. Charles and Lizzie M. Davison are residing at 129 Central Street. (1929-37)

*** Charlotte Davison, Miss, is a student at Woodsville High School, graduating in 1929. She was voted president of her freshman class and was 1st violinist in the 1925 orchestra. Charlotte and her three sisters would later write the book "HECK", about growing up at 34 King Street, the home of her parents Lewis and Ella Davison. (1929-31) In 1932 Charlotte is teaching in Springfield, Vermont, and still boarding at 34 King Street, the home of her parents, the Lewis Davisons. (1935-37)

*** Elizabeth E. Davison, Miss, graduated from Woodsville High School in 1930. Charlotte and her three sisters would later write the book "HECK", about growing up at 34 King Street, the home of her parents Lewis and Ella Davison. (1929-31) Elizabeth enrolled at UNH and is now teaching and still boarding at 34 King Street, the home of her parents, the Lewis Davisons. (1935-37)

*** Floyd G. and Florence B. Davison board on Beech Street. Floyd is a train man. (1919) Floyd and Florence have a home at 36 Smith Street in 1925. Floyd is Manager of Johnson Educator Company, 30 Railroad Street, Loose Wiles Biscuit Company. Floyd and Florence have a home at 21 Pleasant Street. (1935-37) Floyd is a conductor on the railroad and the Davisons reside at 19 Gordon Place. (1953-55) The Davisons removed to 11 Main Street, Berlin, NH, prior to 1956.

*** George A. Davison, born in Canada in 1853, 139 Central Street. His brother Edgar Davison born in Canada in 1855, lives with him. George's spouse is Lizzie G. Davison born in Canada in 1856. Her parents Langdon Bailey born 1822 and Mary W. Bailey born 1830 live with the Davisons. 1917-1919. George is a R. R. Station Agent. Living with the Davison's in 1880 were ... George's brother, Edgar Davison age 25, born in Canada in 1855, a railroad clerk, Lizzies father Langdon Bailey age 58 and a farmer ny trade, and Lizzies mother Mary W. Bailey age 50.

*** Harold King Davison ... (1893-1983) Harold K. Davison was born April 12th, 1893 and died January 15th, 1983. His father was Lewis E. Davison who married Anna M. King on September 10th. Harold graduated from Woodsville High School in 1911. Anna King Davison and their daughter died soon after returning from a trip, leaving Lewis and young son Harold K. In 1907 Lewis married Ella G. Chadwick and they had four daughters;

Kathleen 6-25-1908, became Mrs. Kathleen Jackson, lived and taught school in Laconia, NH and lived to be 100 years old. Charlotte 8-30-1912, Elizabeth 4-30-1914 and Harriett 12-10-1916.

The four girls wrote the book entitled HECK, later in life. It depicted there childhood experiences.

Each of the girls participated in the book writing individual chapters and making drawings. It is well written and recommended reading for local History buffs. Harold was a student at Dartmouth in 1915. Harold K, was living with his grandmother on the King farm by this time and inherited the farm, upon her death.

Harold and wife Gladys sold the farm to James Rowe and moved to the brick house on King Street; two houses from Harold's fathers, the first house off the high school steps.

Harold, won the Distinguished Service Award in WW I when he was a Major in the Yankee Division. He was appointed GOP Doorkeeper in 1920 and was Speaker of the House in 1921 & 1927, State Senator and President of the N.H. Senate, Commander of the NH Department of American Legion.

In 1963 Harold wrote the book "Town of Haverhill", a copy of his book is in the Woodsville Library.

In 1925 Harold K. Davison is an attorney at 65 Central Street. He and Gladys are living on the King Farm, which Harold inherited, on North Court Street. (1925) Harold's Attorney's office is at 55 Central Street, room #1, the Thompson - Castello block, on the corner of Central and Pleasant Streets. Harold is also President of the Senate. The phone numbers are; 194 for the office and 183-3 for the ir home. Harold and Gladys are still living on the King Farm, at 56 South Court Street. (later became the Rowe farm) (1929-31) Harold is an attorney with an office at 55 Central Street, the Thompson-Castello Block, room #1. Harold and Gladys have moved from the King farm to 58 King Street. (1935-37) Harold is chairman of the Public Utilities Commission, 1st V. P. of the Newbury Bank, attorney at 13 Pleasant Street, room 6. (1953-58)

*** Harriette L. Davison, Miss, is a student at Boston University, boarding at her parents home, Lewis and Ella Davison, at 34 King Street. (1935-37)

*** Harry C. Davison is in the auto livery business at 129 Central Street (1919).

*** Kathleen C. Davison, Miss, graduated from Woodsville High School in 1926. She won 1st prize for speaking on June 19th, 1925. She is a student at Keene Normal School, boarding at her parents home, Lewis and Ella Davison, at 34 King Street. (1929-31) Kathleen is teaching in Laconia, NH in 1932, and boarding at her parents home, Lewis and Ella Davison, at 34 King Street. (1935-37)

*** John Davison graduated from Woodsville High School in 1935 and entered Mass Institute of Technology.

*** Lewis E. Davison, born in Canada in 1869, married Anna M. King on September 10th, 1890. Anna and their daughter died soon after returning from a trip, leaving Lewis and young son Harold K. In 1907 Lewis married Ella G. Chadwick, born in 1880, and they had four daughters; Kathleen 6-25-1908,

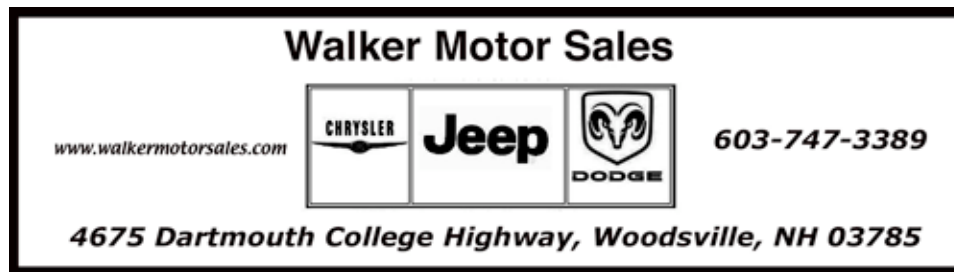
