\*\*\* Isaac K. George, Jr. [Birth 21 December 21st, 1837 in Sutton, New Hampshire ... Death March 7th, 1925 in Haverhill, New Hampshire]. He married Isabelle Amanda Simonds from Alexandria on 3-31-1858. The marriage took place in Bristol, NH. Isabelle was born on February 20th, 1836 in Carlisle, Mass. and died in Woodsville March 14th, 1933. Isaac was superintendent of the Grafton County Farm and alms house, in 1873. Mr. George lived in John L. Woods' house at #4 Ammonoosuc Street and was engaged in the hotel and boarding house business in Woodsville. Isaac and his wife, Belle, managed the Brunswick Hotel at 119 Central Street from 1886 until 1890. Isaac George worked for Fall Mountain Paper as boss of the logging drives in the Ammonoosuc River. This was in the early 1890's. The loggers would camp out in back of Isaacs property, waiting for the Van Dyke drive to pass by the Ammonoosuc entrance to the Connecticut River. Listed as being retired in 1919, at 4 Ammonoosuc Street. After retirement Isaac and Isabel George lived in their home at 4 Ammonoosuc Street, one of the oldest homes in Woodsville. (1925) Isaac died prior to 1931 and Isabel is living in their home at 4 Ammonoosuc Street. (1929-31) Isabel passed away prior to 1935. The George's had a daughter, Mary, who married Sidney D. Tilton, a concrete contractor. Isaac George and his son leased the restaurant in the Music Hall on Pleasant Street in 1893. The business would continue running as a restaurant with the addition of a pool and billiards room. The dining room seated 75 persons. George gave up the restaurant in 1896, but continued running the billiards room. The building burned in 1901. Bella's mother, Mary Pattee Simonds, died at Bella's home in Woodsville on 11-18-1905, at the age of 101 years and 11 months. The Georges had 4 children:

1) Charles E. born on 12-20-1857, an attorney. 2) Mary W. born on 11-1-1860. Married S. D. Tilton 3) Lewis C. born on 5-31-1861. Married Nellie Louise Noyes from Landaff on 6-14-1893 4) Rena Isabel born in 1868 and died in 1871. The Georges had two lodgers in 1920 ... Robert L Atkins born in 1892, in England in 1920 and William L Mcnamara born in 1883 in NH.

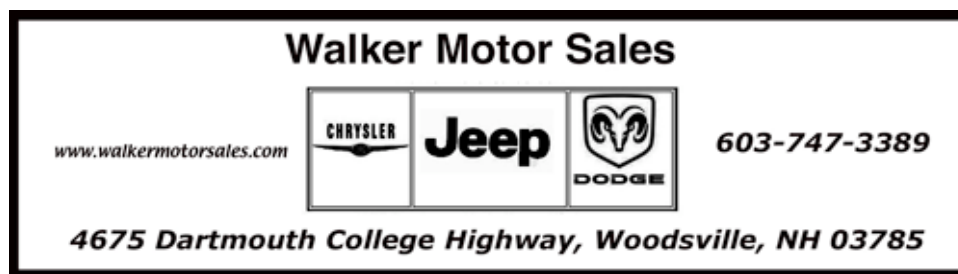

Doctor Gibson was a Republican and a trustee of Woodsville Guaranty Savings Bank. Dr. Gibson was a legislator in 1897. Dr. Gibson first married S. Jennie Park from Plymouth, NH, on 1-21-1880. Later married Jennie L. Quimby from New York, in 1913. They had no children. Dr. Charles Gibson is listed as deceased in 1919. Jennie L. Gibson, his widow is listed as living at 10 Pleasant Street.
