***Underhill ...*** Miss Lottie M. B. Underhill is a graduate nurse and rooms at Dr. E. M. Miller's at 6 School Street. (1915) (1919) Lottie is boarding at 36 King Street, the home of Fred T. Pillsbury. (1925-37)

***Underwood ...*** Clinton P. Underwood is a shipper for Armour Company, at 38 Railroad Street. Clinton is rooming at 35 Central Street. (1919)

***United American Mechanics ...*** an office somewhere in Woodsville ??? (No additional Info) (1915) (1919)

***Universalist Church ...***

**1891** is when the first Universalist service was held. The lot on Elm Street was purchased in 1892 and Martin W. Perkins completed the building late that same year.

The building remains today (2008), however the steeple is no longer attached. It landed on the front lawn during the hurricane of 1938 and was never replaced. The church is presently owned (2008) by the Calvary Baptist Church.

Mr. and Mrs. C. E. Randall, and others, founded the Universalist Church in Woodsville in 1891.

Mrs. Randall, Mary, gave bible lessons in her home and was known to share her bowl of candy with the children attending.

Mary Randall's brother was the Reverend Walter Dole. Mary Randall was also instrumental in the founding of the high school.

Mr. Randall died in 1912 and Mary took over their coal business. She advertised, "No long wait for your coal and no short weights when you get it!" Mary was known to have loaded trucks herself.

She sold the business to Mr. Craig in 1937 and it became Woodsville Fuel Company.

Rev. Frederick L. Carrier was ordained as pastor of the Universalist Church in Woodsville in 1894. He enlisted as a private in the Spanish-American War in 1898. Private Carrier was commissioned as chaplain, very soon after enlisting. After the war, in 1902, he resigned his pastorate and moved to Little Rock, Arkansas. The church became inactive in 1956.

Rev. A. W. Altenburg is the minister at the Universalist Church. (1943)

***U. S. Dept. of Agriculture ...*** Agriculture and soil conservation Dept. at 13 Pleasant Street, room 5. (1953 - 1955) removed to 31 South Court Street, in the post office extension, after the Odd Fellows Block burned.. (1956 - 1958)

***U. S. Post Office ...*** Kellett V. Stockheimer, postmaster. (1953 - 1958)

***Upton ...***

**\*\*\*** Archibald Upton is a chain engineer on the B&M RR. He rooms at Mrs. Merrill's Court Street Lodge, Court Street (1915).

**\*\*\*** Thomas J. Upton is a train dispatcher and rooms at Court Street Lodge, Court Street (1915). A Thomas J. Upton is a towerman in 1919 and has a house at 8 Highland Street. Thomas and Grace M. Upton have a home at 48a Ammonoosuc Street in 1925. The Upton's presently have a home at 12 King Street. (1929-31)

**\*\*\*** Mrs. T. J. Upton is a telephone operator with the White Mountain Telephone Company in the Odd Fellows Block, second floor, 17 Pleasant Street. Mrs. Upton rooms at Mrs. Kimball's on Highland Street. (1919)

**\*\*\*** William R. Upton is a signalman for the railroad. William and Mildred A Upton have a home at 22 Maple Street. (1929-31)

***Utten ...*** Mr. Utten is a freight brakeman for the B&M RR. Mr. Utten and Mrs. Lizzie Utten have house on Beech Street (1915).

***Uttin ...***

**\*\*\*** Miss Geraldine S. Uttin is employed at 47 Central Street, Spofford's Drug Store, and boarding at 5 Smith Street, the home of Josiah S. Uttin. (1935 -1937)

**\*\*\*** Josiah S. Uttin is a freight brakeman for the railroad. Josiah and Elizabeth A. Uttin have a home at 29 Central Street. (1919) The Uttin's have a home at 5 Smith Street. (1925 - 1937) Elizabeth died on September 20th, 1950. Josiah, a conductor on the railroad, is living at 38 South Court Street, in the Howe House. (1953 - 1955) Josiah is retired and residing at 40 South Court Street. (1956 - 1958)
