

THE WOODSVILLE CAFE LOCATED AT 15 CENTRAL STREET

This building, between the bowling alley and the Bittinger Building, has been an eating establishment since it's early existence. In 1899 Johnson's Lunch cart was moved here and made over into a restaurant. It then became the Coffee Pot, in 1916 the Woodsville Lunch, in 1925 it became Jigg's Lunch.

In 1928 it became the Woodsville Cafe, and in 1960 Pete and Bernice Tegu opened it as Tegu's Diner. It is now (2008) McAllister Jewelers.

The building to the right, in the picture, may have been a blacksmith's shop in the late 1800's and early 1900's.
